

STATUTE

ESET Science Award

Preamble

The ESET Foundation, in cooperation with ESET, spol. s r.o.:

1. being acutely aware of the key significance of science in the development and prosperity of society,
 2. intending to focus its efforts on enhancing the motivation of scientists to achieve internationally acclaimed scientific results,
 3. with the intention to also enhance the recognition of Slovak scientists' achievements at the international level and thus to elevate the prestige of Slovak science globally,
- supports the Slovak science community and the overall development of Slovakia by way of the prestigious **ESET Science Award**.

ART. 1

Categories

The award is granted to individuals in three categories:

1. Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia
2. Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia Under the Age of 35
3. Outstanding Academic in Slovakia

One award is granted in each category once per year.

ART. 2

Nomination criteria in the respective categories

1. Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia

- a) The award is granted to an individual whose work results in the past 10 years have made exceptional contributions to highlighting Slovak science in the European or global science area, and which have a remarkable actual or potential impact on their respective scientific field.
- b) The nominee must be a scientist associated with an organisation that is demonstrably involved in science and research (in particular Slovak universities, institutes of the Slovak Academy of Sciences, sectoral research departments, legal persons with registered offices in Slovakia) (hereinafter as the "Organisation"). Furthermore, he/she must have been the Organisation's employee, shareholder, member, statutory body or a member of the statutory body, proxy, permanent public service employee, or an employee performing work in the public interest for no less than three years before the date of closing of the nominations, whereby the vast majority of the scientific results for which they were nominated must have been achieved within the Organisation.

- c) The nominee must be active in one of the fields of science and technology assigned a numeric code (010000 – 040500 inclusive) pursuant to Directive No. 27/2006-R of 21 December 2006 on the system of science and technology fields and the science and technology field code-list.
- d) The nominee must be regarded as an outstanding scientist in their respective scientific field (hereinafter as the “Nominee’s expertise”).
- e) The Nominee’s expertise shall be demonstrated as follows:
 - i) authorship or co-authorship of a significant published work or published works with a verifiable impact on the global research area;
 - ii) citations in acknowledged Current Content journals with a verifiable impact on the global research area;
 - iii) involvement in international research projects with a verifiable impact on the global research area;
 - iv) enhancing the professional recognition of Slovak science and research abroad in a manner other than those outlined above;
 - v) contribution of scientific research work with an impact on society.
- f) An important criterion also consists of the nominee’s verifiable exceptional contribution to Slovak society.
- g) An award laureate may be nominated again three years after receiving the award.

2. Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia Under the Age of 35

- a) The award is granted to a young scientist whose activity may be regarded as an exceptional contribution to the Slovak scientific field with great future potential.
- b) The nominee must be a scientist who has successfully concluded doctoral studies and who is not older than 35 years as of the calendar year of their nomination. He/she must have been cooperating with the same Organisation for no less than three years before the date of closing of the nominations in the respective year.
- c) The nominee must be active in one of the fields of science and technology assigned a numeric code (010000 – 040500 inclusive) pursuant to Directive No. 27/2006-R of 21 December 2006 on the system of science and technology fields and the science and technology field code-list.
- d) The Nominee’s expertise shall be demonstrated by meeting at least two criteria specified in clause 1, par. e), sections i. through iv. hereof, and the criterion specified in clause 1, par. e), section v. hereof.
- e) An important criterion also consists of the nominee’s verifiable exceptional contribution in their respective research field at the global scientific level in the respective field.
- f) Each award winner may only receive the award once.

3. Outstanding Academic in Slovakia

- a) The award is granted to an individual whose activities have delivered an exceptional academic contribution in their field.
- b) The nominee must be a university academic working at an accredited higher education institution in Slovakia (vysoká škola/univerzita) (hereinafter as a “University”) for at least 3 years. The nominee must have been working at said University with a stipulated weekly working time (i.e. the extent of the employment relationship must be 100%).
- c) The nominee must have been active in one of the below-mentioned fields of study grouped according to www.portalvs.sk, a university portal, that takes into account the Slovak set of study fields published as decree of the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport of the Slovak Republic no. 244/2019 Coll., on the set of study fields of the Slovak Republic:

- i) natural sciences, mathematics, and informatics;
 - ii) technical sciences;
 - iii) agricultural and veterinary sciences;
 - iv) medical and health sciences and fields focused on improving quality of life.
- d) The nominee's expertise is assessed according to his/her academic skills and scientific productivity as demonstrated over the previous 6 years, pursuant to the following criteria:
- i) conducting and initiating of classes;
 - ii) professional results achieved by supervised students;
 - iii) participation in accredited study programmes;
 - iv) making the scientific field visible through the organisation of student events or other forms of promotion;
 - v) authorship or co-authorship of (a) significant publication(s);
 - vi) citations in reputable journals with high impact;
 - vii) participation in international research projects;
 - viii) student feedback and references.
- e) Each award winner may only receive the award once.

ART. 3

Submission of nominations in the respective categories

1. Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia

- A scientist who meets the conditions may nominate himself/herself, or he/she can be nominated by the Organisation with which he/she is cooperating, with his/her consent.
- Nominations are submitted electronically in English by filling out the form on the ESET Science Award webpage (www.ESETScienceAward.com).

2. Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia Under the Age of 35

- The nomination may be submitted by a direct superior in the nominee's Organisation, with the nominee's consent.
- A scientist who meets the conditions may not nominate himself/herself.
- Nominations are submitted electronically in English by filling out the form on the ESET Science Award webpage (www.ESETScienceAward.com).

3. Outstanding Academic in Slovakia

- The University academic who meets the conditions may nominate himself/herself, or he/she can be nominated by his/her superior at the University he/she works at, with his/her consent.
- Nominations are submitted electronically by filling out the form on the ESET Science Award webpage (www.ESETScienceAward.com).

With their nomination, each nominee must submit a statement of compliance with the principles of the [National Code of Conduct for Scientific Integrity](#)¹ (hereinafter as the „Code of Conduct“), which forms Annex 1 to the Declaration on Fostering the Culture of Scientific Integrity in Slovakia published by the Slovak Centre of Scientific and Technical Information.

ART. 4**Assessment of the award nominations**

Award laureates in the categories „Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia“ and „Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia Under the Age of 35“ are selected from the finalists by an international committee comprised of selected international experts (hereinafter as the „International Committee“). Its members are published annually on the ESET Science Award website (www.ESETScienceAward.com). The finalists in both categories will be selected by the ESET Foundation via committees comprised of experts from various scientific fields.

The award laureate in category „Outstanding Academic in Slovakia“ is selected by an evaluation committee comprised of selected Slovak experts, the list of whom is published on the ESET Science Award website (www.ESETScienceAward.com) following the official announcement of the laureate.

The assessment of award nominations in all categories also includes an assessment of compliance with the principles of research ethics and integrity specified in the Code of Conduct².

The award organizers reserve the right to select any number of finalists or not to select a laureate at all.

ART. 5**ESET Science Award schedule**

The ESET Science Award is granted annually beginning in 2019.

The opening and closing dates for nominations for the respective calendar year are published annually on the ESET Science Award webpage (www.ESETScienceAward.com) in the course of the respective year. The award laureates are announced during the celebratory gala evening in October of the respective calendar year.

ART. 6**Awards in the respective categories****1. Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia**

- The laureate receives a financial prize in the amount of EUR 100,000. The prize is not bound to any particular purpose. A symbolic work of art is also part of the prize.
- The finalist in this category receives a financial prize in the amount of EUR 3,000.

2. Outstanding Scientist in Slovakia Under the Age of 35

- The laureate receives a financial prize in the amount of EUR 10,000. The prize is not bound to any particular purpose. A symbolic work of art is also part of the prize.
- The finalist in this category receives a financial prize in the amount of EUR 1,000.

3. Outstanding Academic in Slovakia

- The laureate receives a financial prize in the amount of EUR 10,000. The prize is not bound to any particular purpose. A symbolic work of art is also part of the prize.
- The finalist in this category receives a financial prize in the amount of EUR 1,000.

The amount of the financial prize specified in this article represents an amount net of the tax payable pursuant to the Act 595/2003 Coll., on Income Tax, as amended, and is not bound to any particular purpose.

Should the laureate violate the Code of Conduct in a substantial manner, the ESET Foundation becomes entitled to remove the ESET Science Award and the symbolic work of art from the laureate. Upon the request of the Foundation, the laureate becomes obligated to return the symbolic work of art and to stop using the title of ESET Science Award laureate in the respective category and abstain from any acts that could damage the reputation of the ESET Foundation in connection with the received award.

ART. 7

Consent with the statute and subsequent communication and media coverage

By submitting a nomination or giving consent to the submission of a nomination, the nominee freely and unconditionally consents to the conditions of the ESET Science Award Statute. For the purposes of securing the handling and registration of the submission, assessment by the commission, notifying of the results, organisation of the celebratory gala evening and the handling of its invitations, and commercial marketing within the framework of the ESET Science Award, the nominee also acknowledges that the ESET Foundation may process personal data which is a part of the nomination and the corresponding documentation, as well as other data obtained in connection with the ESET Science Award in compliance with the [Privacy Statement](#). If the nomination is submitted by a third party, an essential condition of the submission is the nominee's consent to the submission. The nominee's consent to the submission must also include the explicit consent of the nominee with this statute and a confirmation of being familiar with the [Privacy Statement](#).

By submitting a nomination or giving consent to the submission of a nomination, the nominee agrees that if he/she becomes the finalist or laureate of the award, he/she also consents to the following obligations:

- participation in the celebratory gala evening of the respective year;
- presentation of their work within the remit of the scientific award project during activities intended to promote the recognition of the project (media presentation, public lectures, debates) and the ESET Science Award. The scope of the presentation will be personally agreed;
- active participation in the group of laureates and finalists of the ESET Science Award and other promotional activities of this group even after receiving the prize within the ESET Science Award category in which the nominee was nominated. The scope will be personally agreed.

ART. 8

Final Provisions

This statute has been approved by the ESET Foundation Governing Board and its current wording is available on the ESET Science Award webpage (www.ESETScienceAward.com).

This statute comes into force on 15 March 2022 and supersedes the ESET Science Award Statute that came into force on 15 March 2021.
